

2024 YOUTH CAMP - CODE OF CONDUCT - CAMPER

The following guidelines are designed to make your experience at Youth Camp satisfying to you and to all others attending. Please read these guidelines carefully and sign below:

1. Respect the rights and property of others.
2. Do not touch other camper's belongings.
3. Disrespectful, abusive language will not be tolerated. (No profanity, racial slurs, or coarse jesting)
4. Do not damage or deface camp/church facilities or property.
5. Rudeness, lack of courtesy, and disrespect for authority will not be tolerated.
6. Boys are not allowed in the girls' camp; girls are not allowed in the boys' camp.
7. You may not enter someone else's tent without permission.
8. All clothing worn should be within the bounds of godly modesty. No halter tops, low-cut shirts, or half shirts. Sleeveless t-shirts are permitted, but you may not have huge cuts in the armpits that expose your skin or sports-bra. Shorts must be mid-thigh or longer.
9. Items of clothing which display profanity, alcohol, or drugs will not be allowed.
10. Waterslide apparel needs to include trunks or shorts and a t-shirt. Girls should wear a one-piece underneath.
11. No climbing on the building or other structures around the property.
12. All prescriptions and over the counter drugs must be given to the Camp Nurse immediately upon arrival.
13. No inappropriate displays of affection.
14. You are required to be in your tent by midnight and quiet by 12:30 am. This is "lights out," meaning a time to sleep. No late-night discussions, games, or music.

Any violation of the above rules will result in a warning and possible restrictions for the remainder of the week. Repeated violations may result in expulsion from camp.

The following infractions will result in a phone call to parents and immediate expulsion from camp:

1. Fighting or physically threatening to hurt someone.
2. Being found in possession of alcohol, tobacco, firearms, or other weapons.
3. Being found visibly intoxicated or high.
4. Leaving the property without permission.
5. Stealing from campers, counselors, or the church.
